Coliman Malbec-Bonarda

Region

With around 15,000 hectares under vine, Rivadavia, running east to west along either side of the Tunuyan River, is the second largest subregion in East Mendoza. Flat and fertile with sandy-loam soil, Rivadavia is warmer, with less diurnal temperature variation than other regions of Mendoza. It produces wines with a riper, fuller character than higher altitude vineyards. Some subregions such as Medrano are also well-known for their high-quality old vine production.

Producer

Bodega Los Haroldos, owned by the Falasco family, is one of Argentina's leading family-owned wineries. Today the fourth generation continues the story that began in 1939 when Haroldo Santos Falasco, known as 'Don Lolo', began to wheel his bicycle through the streets of his small hometown of Chacabuco, 200km west of Buenos Aires, selling his wines from the basket on the front. Eighty years later, Franco Falasco and his siblings are responsible for their family's legacy: creating wines of excellence and quality for the world to enjoy.

Vinification

This wine is unoaked.

Tasting Note

A nose of red cherries and ripe fruit leads to a soft and juicy palate. Bonarda in the mix here, lightens things up and brings a different berried fruit dimension, the marriage with Malbec resulting in a deliciously drinkable and fresh style.
